

Provide meaningful volunteer opportunities that make a difference for wildlife and people

Have expert Volunteer Managers that share their skills and knowledge

Enable like-minded people who share a passion to connect and build friendships

Provide a range of events and training sessions that give volunteers a chance to learn and develop More flexible volunteering – evening, weekends, and remote opportunities

> Connect lone volunteers, who are part of a wider group on reserves - such as livestock checkers and surveyors to allow better communication and networking

Ensure tools are fit for purpose and replacing broken tools quickly

Proactive communication - keep volunteers in the loop with advanced notice of volunteering needs and changes, plus wider Trust news

The survey data will be used to improve our volunteering processes and support of volunteers. It is shared with our Senior Leadership Team and staff team who in turn will use feedback to inform future strategic plans and how we deliver our volunteering activities on the ground.

Some of the areas we'll be working on in the next year will include:

- Providing more flexible opportunities to allow a wider range of people to volunteer

- Developing opportunities both online and in real life for volunteers to find out more about our work and meet one another.
- Ensuring there is a consistently good level of experience for volunteers across the Trust. This includes providing quality tools, training and ongoing support.
- Building on the existing good levels of communication we have, by exploring further ways of connecting with our volunteers and assisting networking among our volunteers.
