2018

- Summer visitors are of course migrating back to natal breeding grounds in the UK. **Chiffchaff** (2 on 11th and 7 on 25th) and **Sand martin** (1 on 14th and 6 on 26th) gives an example of early passage migration through Potteric Carr of these harbingers of spring.
- A Black-necked grebe appeared on Huxter Well Marsh on 16th and remained to the month end.
- **Pintail** were recorded on a number of dates, with max 4 on 5th and there were 2 **Egyptian geese** on 6th/13th/27th. WeBS counts on 18th revealed 108 **Wigeon**, 128 **Teal**, 110 **Gadwall** and 71 **Shoveler** (90 on 2nd) among other wildfowl. 10 **Shelduck** was the max, on 8th and 2 **Goosander** visited on 30th.

- Some winter birds remained with 50 **Siskin** on 6th/20th, the wintering **Stonechat** (2) to 7th, 45 **Redwing** on 18th feeding in leaf litter, and the long-staying **Whooper swan** still present on 29th.
- **Bearded tit** on 9th meant that this species has been recorded at Potteric Carr for the sixth consecutive month, but will birds remain into the breeding season? Look out and listen for them.
- Waders of interest including Woodcock (max 2 on 9th); Black-tailed godwit on 11th and a good count of 43 Snipe on 18th. Curlew flew over on 22nd. There were 2 Redshank on 11th, 5 Avocet on 25th and 4 Oystercatcher on 27th.
- Lesser spotted woodpecker on 5th, 8th and 9th was tantalizing, but the species remains elusive. There were 2 Nuthatch on 5th and 23rd, and 10 Meadow pipit on 18th.
- Again, at least one Willow tit and Marsh tit were recorded, including the former holding a territory.
- March 7th brought a **Red kite** and a **Peregrine** (also on 21st) to the Reserve. Other birds of prey included up to 6+ soaring **Buzzards, Barn owl** and **Tawny owl**.

- Water rail and Kingfisher were seen on several dates. 450 pre-nesting Black-headed gulls had returned to Huxter Well Marsh by the 8th; increasing thereafter despite last year's colony being heavily predated.
- Marsh harrier and Bittern (up to 6, 11th) were, as ever, popular with visitors, with Beeston Hide proving to be the best place to watch up to 4 Bitterns all at the same time. 6+ singing **Cetti's** warbler were located, and 6 Little egret fed in St Catherine's Field on 13th.

- Potteric Carr is celebrating its 50th anniversary this year and there will be a number of related events taking place on the nature reserve during 2018.
- 5 **Dunlin** were at the iPort lakes on 3rd and a **Little ringed plover** on 27th. Some local **Reed buntings** were still feeding in suburban Bessacarr gardens during the mid-month cold spell, but others sang in territory on the Reserve.
- Please report anyone seen with a dog on Huxter Well Marsh to Reserve staff. Recent disturbance to reedbed nesting birds by a dog has been witnessed and is an offence.
