

Potteric Carr Golden Jubilee 2018 April 2018

Potteric Carr Bird Highlights

- The nesting season was well underway despite below average temperatures for the first two weeks of April and trees not in leaf due to a late, wet spring. Remarkably, one day produced the highest April temperatures in England since 1949. Water levels throughout the reserve were above average all month.
- 11 Chiffchaff heralded in April, on 1st, with 19 on 7th/8th. Other warbler arrivals included Sedge warbler on 9th, Willow warbler singing next day, Grasshopper warbler on 16th, Lesser whitethroat on 17th, Garden warbler and 2 Reed warbler on 19th, when Blackcap numbers totalled over 20. Two Whitethroat on 24th was a relatively late arrival date.

- Other migrants included a **Swallow** on 2nd and 100 **Sand martin** flying through on 3rd (with 150 on 24th), a **Wheatear** on 17th, the first **Cuckoo** on 21st, 3 **House martin** on 24th and 3 **Swift** next day.
- Black-necked grebe was recorded all month, with 1–3 birds present on Huxter Well Marsh. 16 Little grebe on 7th and 7 Great crested grebe on 8th.
- A Bearded tit at Huxter Well Marsh on 15th was the seventh consecutive month to be recorded.

- A **Great white egret** put in an appearance on 7th and there were 11 **Little egret** on 3rd (one wearing a colour-ring (photo) on 11th). 2 **Cranes** circled the reserve on 15th. Up to 4 **Bittern** were on site in April and a male was occasionally heard booming.
- Up to 13 **Avocet** were on West Scape at one time (15th). Whimbrel was recorded on 17th and 25th. 2 **Redshank** (11th) and 3 **Oystercatcher**, and 20 **Snipe** (1st) were also of interest. A colour-ringed Avocet seen on 21st had been ringed in France. One **Little ringed plover** was on West Scrape on 24th/27th, with a **Common sandpiper** on the latter date.
- There were several records of a pair of **Egyptian geese** that moved between the reserve and the iPort lakes. As well as the regular **Whooper swan** present to 19th, there were two on 1st. **Greylag goose** appeared with six goslings on 17th and **Canada goose** with 4 young on 27th.
- There were 6 **Siskin** on 4th and a **Nuthatch** on 6th. The only record of **Kingfisher** was one on 1st. There were 3 **Water rail** on 3rd/10th, and 70 **Teal** on 10th.

- The three Black-headed gull colonies were depleted down to a total of circa 70 pairs. 10 Cetti's
 warbler sang around the site, indicating good winter survival rates for this species. Skylark singing on
 Central Grassland on 17th was a welcome sound but was not heard again and Lapwings attempting to
 nest on the same grassland were harassed by corvids.
- Marsh harriers were regularly seen, with two pairs displaying over the site. Several pairs of **Buzzard** held territory in the area all month, with two pairs of **Sparrowhawk** and **Kestrel** also present. A **Peregrine** was seen on 3rd/24th and a **Hobby** on 28th.

RELATED NEWS

- iPort buffer land birds included some interesting sightings: 3 Ringed plover and 3 LRP on 7th, Arctic tern on 11th/27th, 2 Ring ouzel and Whinchat on 16th, 20+ White wagtails on 18th and a Red kite on 20th. 5 Yellow wagtail on 24th, 18 Wheatear on 27th and 2 Barnacle goose on 28th. There is nowhere to park cars close to the iPort lakes, which are viewable from the public bridleway.
- Bird feeding at Willow Pool Hide has been discontinued for the summer, but will resume in September.


