This traineeship will enable your communication and presentation skills to develop, which will assist in confidence building, and knowledge building. As you will be based at Potteric Carr nature reserve and through this you will also gain invaluable ID skills and management experience alongside experienced staff. There are opportunities to visit other teams across the Trust to gain a full understanding of the activities and aims of an environmental charity. There will be plenty of opportunities to develop social media promotion, and IT skills like budgeting, risk assessing and admin tasks.</p>
