What to do...



Headland hike

Enjoy the colours of autumn as the woodland meets the sea in a Danes Dyke to South Landing loop (3 miles). YO15 1AA

Lighthouse lookout Walk the two miles from North Landing to the Lighthouse. (Open Friday, Saturday and Sunday from end of September). (2)

A fish supper Enjoy fish and chips straight out of the paper with a side order of fresh sea air!



Migration Marathon!

Autumn is an amazing time to see flocks of migratory birds all along the Yorkshire Coast. More seasonal spectacles await...

A short drive away...

Picturesque peninsula Enjoy stunning cliff top and coastline views from Filey Brigg. Also keep an eye out for harbour porpoise, whales and seals on a calm day. YO14 9ET

Seashore stroll Don't miss the five miles of golden sands in Filey Bay itself – or relax and recharge with long shoreline walks at nearby Hunmanby Gap.

Walk this way! From Filey, step on to the England Coast Path National Trail. It connects with the Cleveland Way and Wolds Way for postcard picture views.

Day trip adventures...

East Yorkshire Coast to Coast

Journey at peak migration time (September & October) to Yorkshire's very own Land's End, Spurn Point – 1 hr 40 mins drive from **Bridlington, HU12 0UH**

Using the Discovery Centre as your base at this Yorkshire Wildlife Trust Reserve, you can pack so much wild adventure into one day! Wrap up warm and don't forget your binoculars and camera...






Walk the wildlife trails and settle into a hide. Look out for deer and seals too.



Tour the reserve aboard the Spurn Safari and climb the tallest lighthouse in northern England. 😉





Head to Hornsea Mere

Head south to Yorkshire's largest freshwater lake – a crucial stop off for migrating birds too! (30 mins drive from Bridlington, HU11 5RJ).

Hornsea has a long golden beach, a pretty town centre and marks the eastern end of the Trans Pennine Trail long distance walking route.

Pack a flask and binoculars, settle into a hide and be amazed by vast gatherings of wildfowl.

Fill your lungs with fresh air - a stroll around the lake is a delight whatever the season.

Be charmed by Hornsea town with its Elizabethan mansion, museum and 19th century folly.
