			 Do not share transport if social distancing cannot be maintained. Use separate vehicles or another form of transport. Task cannot be carried-out whilst maintaining 2 metre social distancing If a task is absolutely essential task (see above for reserves tasks) but, because of the nature of the task, social distancing cannot be maintained, then you should not work facing other people but instead work alongside them. Publicise the cleaning/sanitising regime to all premises users personnel, visitors, contractors are working to help keep our personnel and visitors safe, and how they can help in this eg If essential to the task, and sufficient supplies are not available, either:- do not carry-out the task, or reduce the number of participants to match the available supply of cleaning/sanitising materials.
