Out at sea for most of the year, bobbing around in the water in large groups with other puffins. During the summer, I nest on cliffs and islands around the coast of Scotland, northern England, South West England and Wales.

Favourite food
Sand eels! I catch these small
fish by diving and swimming. One
puffin has been recorded carrying 83
sand eels in its beak at once!

Family life
With my lifelong mate,
we raise one single chick a year (a
puffling). We take it in turn to feed our
puffling but leave the nest and return
to sea before it flies off all on its own.

When and where to see me in Yorkshire

May – July at Yorkshire Wildlife Trust's wild and rugged Flamborough Cliffs nature reserve.

I'm endangered
The climate crisis is causing
sea temperatures to rise and the fish
I eat are heading northwards to find
colder waters. I have to travel further
and further to find food and many
chicks are going hungry.

With a brightly coloured beak, decorative eye markings and clumsy waddle on land, it's no wonder I'm known as the 'clown of the sea'!
