Coppicing Monday 20th October

10am to 1pm

Venue: Stainsacre near Whitby Eniov a practical day learning the traditional method of coppicing using a variety of hand tools. Coppicing is a traditional method of woodland management that involves repeatedly felling trees at the base (or stool), and allowing them to regrow allowing sunlight to reach the forest floor, encouraging the growth of various woodland flowers and plants such as bluebells, primroses and violets as well as providing a habitat for many species. Equipment is provided and the delivery of training covers a mix of both theory and practical elements.
